





Think about it: computers aren't just *production tools* anymore in your schools. With 1:1, they're *process* tools.

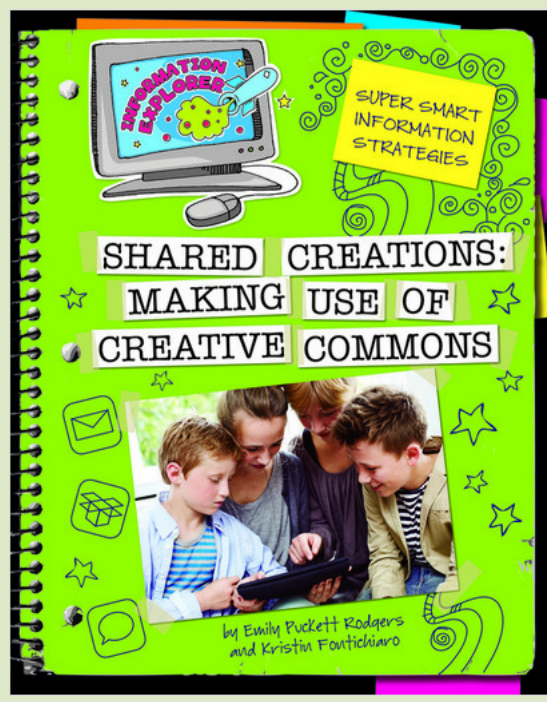
